5	This bill would prohibit the sale, transfer, and
6	possession of an assault weapon subject to certain
7	exceptions.
8	This bill would require a person who possesses
9	an assault weapon to take specified actions.
10	This bill would provide criminal penalties for
11	violations.
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14	A BILL
15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to firearms; to prohibit the possession, sale,
19	or transfer of an assault weapon subject to certain
20	exceptions; to require a person who possesses an assault
21	weapon to take specified actions; and to provide criminal
22	penalties for violations.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following
25	terms have the following meanings:
26	(1) ANTIQUE FIREARM. A firearm or replica of a firearm
27	not designed or redesigned for using rim fire or conventional
28	center fire ignition with fixed ammunition and manufactured in



or before 1898, including any matchlock, flintlock, percussion cap, or similar type of ignition system, and also any firearm using fixed ammunition manufactured in or before 1898, for which ammunition is no longer manufactured in the United States and is not readily available in the ordinary channels of commercial trade.

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(2) ASSAULT WEAPON.

a. Any selective-fire firearm capable of fully
 automatic, semiautomatic, or burst fire at the option of the
 user or any of the following specified semiautomatic firearms:

All AK series, including all of the following: AK,
AKM, AKS, AK-47, AK-74, ARM, MAK90, MISR, NHM90, NHM91, SA 85,
SA 93, VEPR, WASR-10, WUM, Rock River Arms LAR-47, and Vector
Arms AK-47.

All AR series, including all of the following:
AR-10, AR-15, Bushmaster XM15, Armalite AR-180 and M15,
Olympic Arms, AR70, DPMS Tactical Rifles, Smith and Wesson M
and P15 Rifles, Colt AR-15, Rock River Arms LAR-15, and
DoubleStar AR rifles.

132	accommodate a flash suppressor.
133	(v) A grenade launcher.
134	(vi) A shroud attached to the barrel that partially or
135	completely encircles the barrel allowing the bearer to hold
136	the firearm with the non-trigger hand without being burned,
137	but excluding a slide that encloses the barrel.
138	2. A semiautomatic pistol that has the ability to
139	accept a detachable magazine and has one or more of the
140	following:



141 (i) The capacity to accept an ammunition magazine that attaches to the pistol at any location outside of the pistol 142 143 grip. 144 (ii) A threaded barrel capable of accepting a barrel extender, flash suppressor, forward handgrip, or silencer. 145 146 (iii) A slide that encloses the barrel and that permits 147 the shooter to hold the firearm with the non-trigger hand 148 without being burned. 149 (iv) A manufactured weight of 50 ounces or more when the pistol is unloaded. 150 151 (v) A semiautomatic version of an automatic firearm. (vi) Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding 152 grip that can be held by the non-trigger hand. 153 154 (vii) A folding, telescoping, or thumbhole stock. 155 3. A semiautomatic shotgun that has one or more of the 156 following: 157 (i) A folding or telescoping stock. 158 (ii) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath the action of the weapon. 159 160 (iii) A thumbhole stock. 161 (iv) A fixed magazine capacity in excess of five 162 rounds. 163 (v) The ability to accept a detachable magazine. 164 4. Any semiautomatic pistol or centerfire or rimfire rifle with a fixed magazine that has the capacity to accept 165 more than 10 rounds of ammunition. 166 e. The term does not include antique firearms, any 167 168 firearm that has been made permanently inoperable, or any

Has the same meaning as provided in 172 Section 13A-8-1, Code of Alabama 1975. 173 (4) LICENSED GUN DEALER. A person who has a federal 174 firearm license pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 923. (5) MAGAZINE. Any ammunition feeding device. 175 176 (6) PISTOL. Has the same meaning as provided in Section 177 13A-11-70, Code of Alabama 1975. (7) RIFLE. Has the same meaning as provided in Section 178 179 13A-11-62, Code of Alabama 1975. (8) SALE or SELL. The actual approval of the delivery 180 181 of a firearm in consideration of payment or promise of 182 payment. 183 (9) SHOTGUN. Has the same meaning as provided in Section 13A-11-62, Code of Alabama 1975. 184 (10) TRANSFER. The intended delivery of a firearm to a 185 186 person without consideration of payment or promise of payment,

Section 2. (a) A person may not knowingly sell or transfer an assault weapon.

including a gift and loan.

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190 (b) (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2), a191 violation of subsection (a) is a Class B felony.

192 (2) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class A felony
193 if the assault weapon is sold or transferred to a person under
194 18 years of age.

195 (c) This section shall not apply to any of the 196 following:



197 (1) The sale or transfer of an assault weapon to a198 licensed gun dealer.

(2) The sale or transfer of an assault weapon to a law enforcement agency, the Department of Corrections, or the military or naval forces of this state or of the United States for use in the discharge of their official duties.

(3) The transfer by bequest or intestate succession of an assault weapon lawfully possessed pursuant to this act, provided that if the decedent possessed the assault weapon pursuant to Section 4(a)(1)a., the devisee or heir shall have a grace period of 90 days from obtaining possession of the assault weapon to take at least one of the actions required by Section 4(a)(1).

210 Section 3. (a) Beginning June 1, 2026, a person may not 211 possess an assault weapon.

(b) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class C felony.(c) This section shall not apply to any of the

214 following:

(1) A person who possesses an assault weapon if:
a. The person has taken at least one of the actions
required by Section 4(a)(1); and

218 b. The person is otherwise in compliance with this act 219 and the applicable requirements for possession of a firearm in 220 this state.

(2) A member or employee of a law enforcement agency,
the Department of Corrections, or the military or naval forces
of this state or of the United States who possesses an assault
weapon for use in the discharge of his or her official duties.



225 (3) The executor or administrator of an estate that 226 includes an assault weapon lawfully possessed under this act, 227 provided that if the decedent possessed the assault weapon 228 pursuant to Section 4(a)(1)a., the executor or administrator 229 shall have 90 days after obtaining possession in which to take 230 at least one of the actions required by Section 4(a)(1)b., c., 231 or d., unless the transfer of the assault weapon is permitted 232 under Section 2(c)(3). 233 Section 4. (a) (1) Any person who lawfully possessed an assault weapon prior to June 1, 2025, shall do at least one of 234 235 the following on or before June 1, 2026: 236 a. Register the assault weapon with the Alabama State 237 Law Enforcement Agency.

b. Render the assault weapon permanently inoperable.
c. Sell the assault weapon to a licensed gun dealer.
d. Remove the assault weapon from this state.

(2) A member of the military or naval forces of this state or of the United States who is unable to comply with subdivision (1) on or before June 1, 2026 because he or she is or was on official duty outside of this state shall comply with subdivision (1) within 90 days of returning to the state.

(b) (1) The registration of an assault weapon pursuant to paragraph (a) (1) a. shall include all of the following information:

a. A description of the assault weapon that identifiesit uniquely, including all identification marks.

b. The full name, address, date of birth, andfingerprints of the owner, if applicable.



253 c. Any other information the Alabama State Law254 Enforcement Agency deems appropriate.

(2) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall
 conduct a fingerprint-based state and national criminal
 background check of each person registering an assault weapon.

(3) The agency may charge a fee not to exceed fiftydollars (\$50) for the registration of an assault weapon.

(4) The agency shall adopt rules no later than November
1, 2026, to establish procedures for registering an assault
weapon pursuant to this section.

(c) Any person who moves into this state in lawful possession of an assault weapon shall take at least one of the actions required by subsection (a) within 90 days of establishing residency in this state.

267 Section 5. (a) A person who has registered an assault 268 weapon pursuant to Section 4(a)(1)a. may only possess it under 269 the following conditions:

(1) At his or her residence, place of business, or
other property owned by him or her, or on property owned by
another person with the owner's express permission.

(2) On the premises of a target range of a public or private club or organization that holds a regulatory or business license for the purpose of practicing shooting at targets.

(3) On the premises of a licensed shooting club.
(4) While attending any exhibition, display, or
educational project that is about firearms and which is
sponsored by, conducted under the auspices of, or approved by



281 a law enforcement agency or a nationally or state recognized 282 entity that fosters proficiency in, or promotes education 283 about, firearms.

(5) While transporting the assault weapon between any
of the places mentioned in this subsection or to any licensed
gun dealer for servicing or repair, provided the assault
weapon is transported pursuant to subsection (b) (2).

(b) (1) A person may not carry a loaded assault weapon concealed from public view.

(2) A person may not have a loaded or unload assault weapon in any motor vehicle unless the weapon is kept in the trunk of the vehicle, or in a case or other container, and is inaccessible to the operator of or any passenger in the vehicle.

(c) A violation of this section is a Class C felony.
Section 6. (a) (1) A licensed gun dealer that receives
an assault weapon from a person pursuant to this act, at the
time of delivery of the weapon, shall execute a certificate of
transfer and mail or deliver the certificate to the Alabama
State Law Enforcement Agency.

301 (2) The certificate of transfer shall be established by 302 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, provided on the 303 agency's website, and contain all of the following:

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a. The date of sale or transfer.

305 b. The name and address of the seller or transferor and306 his or her Social Security number or driver license number.

307 c. The licensed gun dealer's name and federal firearms308 license number.



309 d. A description of the assault weapon, including the 310 make, model, serial number, and caliber of the assault weapon. 311 e. Any other information that the Alabama State Law 312 Enforcement Agency may prescribe. 313 (b) A licensed gun dealer shall, upon request, present 314 his or her driver license or Social Security card and federal 315 firearms license to a seller or transferor for inspection at 316 the time of purchase or transfer from a person. 317 (c) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall maintain a database of all certificates of transfer and make 318 319 it available for law enforcement purposes. Section 7. Nothing in this act shall be construed to 320 prohibit any person engaged in the business of manufacturing 321 322 assault weapons in this state from manufacturing, 323 transporting, or selling assault weapons in accordance with this act. 324 325 Section 8. This act shall become effective on June 1, 326 2025.
