1 **SECTION 2. Appropriation to the department of health**
2 **care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1,**
3 **2014.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2014, **amend** section 5 of
4 chapter 137, (HB 14-1045), as follows:

5 Section 5. **Appropriation.** (1) In addition to any other
6 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, to the department of
7 health care policy and financing, for the fiscal year beginning July

12 Revised Statutes, and \$4,582,786 from federal funds, to be
13 allocated for the implementation of this act as follows:

21 cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$43 from federal funds,
22 for short-term disability;

23 (d) \$1,652, comprised of \$826 from the breast and cervical
24 cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$826 from federal funds,
25 for S.B. 04-257 amortization equalization disbursement;

26 (e) \$1,550, comprised of \$775 from the breast and cervical
27 cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$775 from federal funds,

1 for S.B. 06-235 supplemental amortization equalization
2 disbursement;

3 (f) \$1,342, comprised of \$671 from the breast and cervical
4 cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$671 from federal funds,
5 for salary survey;

6 (g) \$508, comprised of \$254 from the breast and cervical
7 cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$254 from federal funds,
8 for merit pay;

9 (h) \$332, comprised of \$166 from the breast and cervical
10 cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$166 from federal funds,
11 for operating expenses;

12 (i) \$2,878, comprised of \$1,439 from the breast and
13 cervical cancer prevention and treatment fund and \$1,439 from
14 federal funds, for COFRS modernization;

16 \$2,100,925 from the breast and cervical cancer prevention and

22 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby
23 finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the
