**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT**

1 To amend the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, so as to revise, modernize, correct errors

3 of the work of the Code Revision Commission; to repeal portions of said Code, or Acts in

397 enacted at the 2017 regular session of the General Assembly of Georgia shall supersede the
398 provisions of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated ratified and reenacted by subsection (a)
399 of this section.

400 (e) In the event of a conflict between a provision in Sections 1 through 53 of this Act and
401 a provision of another Act enacted at the 2018 regular session of the General Assembly, the

402 provision of such other Act shall control over the conflicting provision in Sections 1
403 through 53 of this Act to the extent of the conflict.

404 **SECTION 55.**

405 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
406 without such approval.

407 **SECTION 56.**

408 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
