



# SENATE MOTION

MR. PRESIDENT:

**I move** that Senate Bill 13 be amended to read as follows:

- 1 Page 1, delete lines 1 through 17.
- 2 Page 2, delete lines 1 through 35.
- 3 Page 3, line 7, reset in roman "IC 9-21-8-52(b)".
- 4 Page 3, line 7, delete "IC 9-21-8-52(c)".
- 5 Page 3, delete lines 17 through 42.
- 6 Page 4, delete lines 1 through 4.
- 7 Page 4, line 19, reset in roman "IC 9-21-8-52(e)".
- 8 Page 4, line 19, delete "IC 9-21-8-52(f)".
- 9 Page 6, delete lines 15 through 33.
- 10 Page 10, delete lines 19 through 25, begin a new line block indented
- 11 and insert:
  - 12 **"(18) A motor vehicle used by the owner of the motor vehicle**
  - 13 **to commit:**
  - 14 **(A) dangerous spinning (IC 35-43-1-9); or**
  - 15 **(B) obstruction of traffic involving a rotational skid (IC**
  - 16 **35-44.1-2-13)."**
- 17 Page 11, delete lines 31 through 42, begin a new paragraph and
- 18 insert:
  - 19 "SECTION 4. IC 35-43-1-9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
  - 20 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
  - 21 1, 2025]: **Sec. 9. (a) This section does not apply to a person who**
  - 22 **operates a vehicle:**
  - 23 **(1) at an off-road recreation area; or**
  - 24 **(2) at another location where using a vehicle to perform a**
  - 25 **rotational skid is permitted, including on private property if**
  - 26 **authorized by the owner of the property.**
  - 27 **(b) A person who knowingly or intentionally operates a vehicle**

1 in:

2 (1) a repeated or continuous manner with the intent of causing  
3 the vehicle to perform a rotational skid; and

4 (2) a manner that endangers a person;

5 commits dangerous spinning, a Class A misdemeanor.

6 (c) It is a defense to a prosecution under this section that the  
7 skid was performed in a controlled manner with the intent of  
8 avoiding a traffic accident.

9 SECTION 5. IC 35-44.1-2-13, AS AMENDED BY P.L.174-2021,  
10 SECTION 76, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
11 JULY 1, 2025]: Sec. 13. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), a  
12 person who, with the intent to obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic,  
13 obstructs vehicular or pedestrian traffic commits obstruction of traffic,  
14 a Class B misdemeanor.

15 (b) The offense described in subsection (a) is:

16 (1) a Class A misdemeanor if the offense includes the use of a  
17 motor vehicle;

18 (2) a Level 6 felony if:

19 (A) the offense results in serious bodily injury;

20 (B) the person blocks an authorized emergency vehicle (as  
21 defined in IC 9-13-2-6) while the vehicle is:

22 (i) responding to an emergency call;

23 (ii) in the pursuit of an actual or suspected violator of the  
24 law; or

25 (iii) responding to, but not returning from, a fire alarm;

26 if the vehicle is using visible or audible signals as required by  
27 law; or

28 (C) the person obstructs the entryway to a facility that provides  
29 emergency medical services; or

30 (D) the person committed the offense by operating a motor  
31 vehicle in:

32 (i) a repeated or continuous manner with the intent of  
33 causing the vehicle to perform a rotational skid; and

34 (ii) a manner that endangered a person; and

35 (3) a Level 5 felony if the offense results in catastrophic bodily  
36 injury or death.

37 (c) A person who unreasonably obstructs vehicular or pedestrian  
38 traffic commits a Class C infraction.

39 (d) It is a defense to:

40 (1) an action under subsection (b)(2)(D) that the skid was  
41 performed in a controlled manner with the intent of avoiding  
42 a traffic accident; and

43 (2) an action under subsection (c) that the obstruction was caused  
44 by a vehicle malfunction."
