AN ACT

To repeal sections 571.030, 571.101, 571.117, 571.205, and 571.225, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof five new sections relating to the unlawful use of weapons, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 571.030, 571.101, 571.117, 571.205, and 571.225, RSMo, are
2 repealed and five new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 571.030,
3 571.101, 571.117, 571.205, and 571.225, to read as follows:

571.030. 1. A person commits the offense of unlawful use of weapons, except as
2 otherwise provided by sections 571.101 to 571.121, if he or she knowingly:

3 (1) Carries concealed upon or about his or her person a knife, a firearm, a blackjack
4 or any other weapon readily capable of lethal use into any area where firearms are restricted
5 under section 571.107; or

6 (2) Sets a spring gun; or

7 (3) Discharges or shoots a firearm into a dwelling house, a railroad train, boat,
8 aircraft, or motor vehicle as defined in section 302.010, or any building or structure used for
9 the assembling of people; or

10 (4) Exhibits, in the presence of one or more persons, any weapon readily capable of
11 lethal use in an angry or threatening manner; or

12 (5) Has a firearm or projectile weapon readily capable of lethal use on his or her
13 person, while he or she is intoxicated, and handles or otherwise uses such firearm or projectile
14 weapon in either a negligent or unlawful manner or discharges such firearm or projectile
15 weapon unless acting in self-defense; or

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets **[thus]** in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

16 (6) Discharges a firearm within one hundred yards of any occupied schoolhouse,
17 courthouse, or church building; or

18 (7) Discharges or shoots a firearm at a mark, at any object, or at random, on, along or
19 across a public highway or discharges or shoots a firearm into any outbuilding; or

20 (8) Carries a firearm or any other weapon readily capable of lethal use into any
21 church or place where people have assembled for worship, or into any election precinct on
22 any election day, or into any building owned or occupied by any agency of the federal
23 government, state government, or political subdivision thereof; or

24 (9) Discharges or shoots a firearm at or from a motor vehicle, as defined in section
25 301.010, discharges or shoots a firearm at any person, or at any other motor vehicle, or at any
26 building or habitable structure, unless the person was lawfully acting in self-defense; or

27 (10) Carries a firearm, whether loaded or unloaded, or any other weapon readily
28 capable of lethal use into any school, onto any school bus, or onto the premises of any
29 function or activity sponsored or sanctioned by school officials or the district school board; or

30 (11) Possesses a firearm while also knowingly in possession of a controlled substance
31 that is sufficient for a felony violation of section 579.015; or

32 **(12) Carries upon or about his or her person a firearm if the person is under**
33 **twenty-one years of age.**

34 2. Subdivisions (1), (8), and (10) of subsection 1 of this section shall not apply to the
35 persons described in this subsection, regardless of whether such uses are reasonably
36 associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official duties except as
37 otherwise provided in this subsection. Subdivisions (3), (4), (6), (7), and (9) of subsection 1
38 of this section shall not apply to or affect any of the following persons, when such uses are
39 reasonably associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official duties,
40 except as otherwise provided in this subsection:

41 (1) All state, county and municipal peace officers who have completed the training
42 required by the police officer standards and training commission pursuant to sections 590.030
43 to 590.050 and who possess the duty and power of arrest for violation of the general criminal
44 laws of the state or for violation of ordinances of counties or municipalities of the state,
45 whether such officers are on or off duty, and whether such officers are within or outside of the
46 law enforcement agency's jurisdiction, or all qualified retired peace officers, as defined in
47 subsection 12 of this section, and who carry the identification defined in subsection 13 of this
48 section, or any person summoned by such officers to assist in making arrests or preserving the
49 peace while actually engaged in assisting such officer;

50 (2) Wardens, superintendents and keepers of prisons, penitentiaries, jails and other
51 institutions for the detention of persons accused or convicted of crime;

52 (3) Members of the **United States** Armed Forces or National Guard while performing
53 their official duty;

54 (4) Those persons vested by Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri with
55 the judicial power of the state and those persons vested by Article III of the Constitution of
56 the United States with the judicial power of the United States, the members of the federal
57 judiciary;

58 (5) Any person whose bona fide duty is to execute process, civil or criminal;

59 (6) Any federal probation officer or federal flight deck officer as defined under the
60 federal flight deck officer program, 49 U.S.C. Section 44921, regardless of whether such
61 officers are on duty, or within the law enforcement agency's jurisdiction;

62 (7) Any state probation or parole officer, including supervisors and members of the
63 parole board;

64 (8) Any corporate security advisor meeting the definition and fulfilling the
65 requirements of the regulations established by the department of public safety under section
66 590.750;

67 (9) Any coroner, deputy coroner, medical examiner, or assistant medical examiner;

68 (10) Any municipal or county prosecuting attorney or assistant prosecuting attorney;
69 circuit attorney or assistant circuit attorney; municipal, associate, or circuit judge; or any
70 person appointed by a court to be a special prosecutor who has completed the firearms safety
71 training course required under subsection 2 of section 571.111;

72 (11) Any member of a fire department or fire protection district who is employed on a
73 full-time basis as a fire investigator and who has a valid concealed carry endorsement issued
74 prior to August 28, 2013, or a valid concealed carry permit under section 571.111 when such
75 uses are reasonably associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official
76 duties; and

77 (12) Upon the written approval of the governing body of a fire department or fire
78 protection district, any paid fire department or fire protection district member who is
79 employed on a full-time basis and who has a valid concealed carry endorsement issued prior
80 to August 28, 2013, or a valid concealed carry permit, when such uses are reasonably
81 associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official duties.

82 3. Subdivisions (1), (5), (8), and (10) of subsection 1 of this section do not apply
83 when the actor is transporting such weapons in a nonfunctioning state or in an unloaded state
84 when ammunition is not readily accessible or when such weapons are not readily accessible.
85 Subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section does not apply to any person [~~nineteen~~
86 **twenty-one** years of age or older, or eighteen years of age or older and a member of the
87 United States Armed Forces^[7] or honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces,
88 transporting a concealable firearm in the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle, so long

89 as such concealable firearm is otherwise lawfully possessed, nor when the actor is also in
90 possession of an exposed firearm or projectile weapon for the lawful pursuit of game, or is in
91 his or her dwelling unit or upon premises over which the actor has possession, authority or
92 control, or is traveling in a continuous journey peaceably through this state. Subdivision (10)
93 of subsection 1 of this section does not apply if the firearm is otherwise lawfully possessed by
94 a person while traversing school premises for the purposes of transporting a student to or from
95 school, or possessed by an adult for the purposes of facilitation of a school-sanctioned
96 firearm-related event or club event. **Subdivision (12) of subsection 1 of this section does**
97 **not apply to any person who is in the lawful pursuit of game; who is acting in his or her**
98 **capacity as a member of the United States Armed Forces or a law enforcement agency;**
99 **who is in his or her dwelling unit or upon premises over which the person has**
100 **possession, authority, or control; who is traveling in a continuous journey peaceably**
101 **through this state; or who is eighteen years of age or older and a member of the United**
102 **States Armed Forces or honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces.**

103 4. Subdivisions (1), (8), and (10) of subsection 1 of this section shall not apply to any
104 person who has a valid concealed carry permit issued pursuant to sections 571.101 to
105 571.121, a valid concealed carry endorsement issued before August 28, 2013, or a valid
106 permit or endorsement to carry concealed firearms issued by another state or political
107 subdivision of another state.

108 5. Subdivisions (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), (9), and (10) of subsection 1 of this section
109 shall not apply to persons who are engaged in a lawful act of defense pursuant to section
110 563.031.

111 6. Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the contrary, the state shall not
112 prohibit any state employee from having a firearm in the employee's vehicle on the state's
113 property provided that the vehicle is locked and the firearm is not visible. This subsection
114 shall only apply to the state as an employer when the state employee's vehicle is on property
115 owned or leased by the state and the state employee is conducting activities within the scope
116 of his or her employment. For the purposes of this subsection, "state employee" means an
117 employee of the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of the government of the state of
118 Missouri.

119 7. Nothing in this section shall make it unlawful for a student to actually participate in
120 school-sanctioned gun safety courses, student military or ROTC courses, or other school-
121 sponsored or club-sponsored firearm-related events, provided the student does not carry a
122 firearm or other weapon readily capable of lethal use into any school, onto any school bus, or
123 onto the premises of any other function or activity sponsored or sanctioned by school officials
124 or the district school board.

125 8. A person who commits the crime of unlawful use of weapons under:

126 (1) Subdivision (2), (3), (4), or (11) of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of a
127 class E felony;

128 (2) Subdivision (1), (6), (7), or (8) of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of a
129 class B misdemeanor, except when a concealed weapon is carried onto any private property
130 whose owner has posted the premises as being off-limits to concealed firearms by means of
131 one or more signs displayed in a conspicuous place of a minimum size of eleven inches by
132 fourteen inches with the writing thereon in letters of not less than one inch, in which case the
133 penalties of subsection 2 of section 571.107 shall apply;

134 (3) Subdivision (5) ~~or~~, (10), **or (12)** of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of
135 a class A misdemeanor if the firearm is unloaded and a class E felony if the firearm is loaded;

136 (4) Subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of a class B felony,
137 except that if the violation of subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section results in injury or
138 death to another person, it is a class A felony.

139 9. Violations of subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section shall be punished as
140 follows:

141 (1) For the first violation a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term
142 of imprisonment for a class B felony;

143 (2) For any violation by a prior offender as defined in section 558.016, a person shall
144 be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony without
145 the possibility of parole, probation or conditional release for a term of ten years;

146 (3) For any violation by a persistent offender as defined in section 558.016, a person
147 shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony
148 without the possibility of parole, probation, or conditional release;

149 (4) For any violation which results in injury or death to another person, a person shall
150 be sentenced to an authorized disposition for a class A felony.

151 10. Any person knowingly aiding or abetting any other person in the violation of
152 subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of this section shall be subject to the same penalty as that
153 prescribed by this section for violations by other persons.

154 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no person who pleads guilty to or is
155 found guilty of a felony violation of subsection 1 of this section shall receive a suspended
156 imposition of sentence if such person has previously received a suspended imposition of
157 sentence for any other firearms- or weapons-related felony offense.

158 12. As used in this section "qualified retired peace officer" means an individual who:

159 (1) Retired in good standing from service with a public agency as a peace officer,
160 other than for reasons of mental instability;

161 (2) Before such retirement, was authorized by law to engage in or supervise the
162 prevention, detection, investigation, or prosecution of, or the incarceration of any person for,
163 any violation of law, and had statutory powers of arrest;

164 (3) Before such retirement, was regularly employed as a peace officer for an
165 aggregate of fifteen years or more, or retired from service with such agency, after completing
166 any applicable probationary period of such service, due to a service-connected disability, as
167 determined by such agency;

168 (4) Has a nonforfeitable right to benefits under the retirement plan of the agency if
169 such a plan is available;

170 (5) During the most recent twelve-month period, has met, at the expense of the
171 individual, the standards for training and qualification for active peace officers to carry
172 firearms;

173 (6) Is not under the influence of alcohol or another intoxicating or hallucinatory drug
174 or substance; and

175 (7) Is not prohibited by federal law from receiving a firearm.

176 13. The identification required by subdivision (1) of subsection 2 of this section is:

177 (1) A photographic identification issued by the agency from which the individual
178 retired from service as a peace officer that indicates that the individual has, not less recently
179 than one year before the date the individual is carrying the concealed firearm, been tested or
180 otherwise found by the agency to meet the standards established by the agency for training
181 and qualification for active peace officers to carry a firearm of the same type as the concealed
182 firearm; or

183 (2) A photographic identification issued by the agency from which the individual
184 retired from service as a peace officer; and

185 (3) A certification issued by the state in which the individual resides that indicates
186 that the individual has, not less recently than one year before the date the individual is
187 carrying the concealed firearm, been tested or otherwise found by the state to meet the
188 standards established by the state for training and qualification for active peace officers to
189 carry a firearm of the same type as the concealed firearm.

571.101. 1. All applicants for concealed carry permits issued pursuant to subsection
2 7 of this section must satisfy the requirements of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If the said
3 applicant can show qualification as provided by sections 571.101 to 571.121, the county or
4 city sheriff shall issue a concealed carry permit authorizing the carrying of a concealed
5 firearm on or about the applicant's person or within a vehicle. A concealed carry permit shall
6 be valid from the date of issuance or renewal until five years from the last day of the month in
7 which the permit was issued or renewed. The concealed carry permit is valid throughout this
8 state. Although the permit is considered valid in the state, a person who fails to renew his or

9 her permit within five years from the date of issuance or renewal shall not be eligible for an
10 exception to a National Instant Criminal Background Check under federal regulations
11 currently codified under 27 CFR 478.102(d), relating to the transfer, sale, or delivery of
12 firearms from licensed dealers. A concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28,
13 2013, shall continue from the date of issuance or renewal until three years from the last day of
14 the month in which the endorsement was issued or renewed to authorize the carrying of a
15 concealed firearm on or about the applicant's person or within a vehicle in the same manner as
16 a concealed carry permit issued under subsection 7 of this section on or after August 28, 2013.

17 2. A concealed carry permit issued pursuant to subsection 7 of this section shall be
18 issued by the sheriff or his or her designee of the county or city in which the applicant resides,
19 if the applicant:

20 (1) **Is a permanent resident of the United States**, is at least ~~nineteen~~ **twenty-one**
21 years of age, ~~is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States~~ and either:

22 (a) Has assumed residency in this state; or

23 (b) Is a member of the **United States** Armed Forces stationed in Missouri~~;~~ or the
24 spouse of such member of the military;

25 (2) **Is a citizen of the United States**, is at least ~~nineteen~~ **twenty-one** years of age~~;~~
26 or ~~is~~ at least eighteen years of age and a member of the United States Armed Forces or
27 honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces, ~~and is a citizen of the United~~
28 ~~States~~ and either:

29 (a) Has assumed residency in this state; or

30 (b) Is a member of the **United States** Armed Forces stationed in Missouri~~;~~ or

31 ~~the spouse of such member of the military~~ ~~stationed in Missouri and nineteen~~
32 ~~years of age~~;

33 (3) Has not pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere or been convicted of a
34 crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state
35 or of the United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any
36 state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an
37 explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer or gas gun;

38 (4) Has not been convicted of, pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to
39 one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a five-year period
40 immediately preceding application for a concealed carry permit or if the applicant has not
41 been convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the
42 influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled substance
43 within a five-year period immediately preceding application for a concealed carry permit;

44 (5) Is not a fugitive from justice or currently charged in an information or indictment
45 with the commission of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year

46 under the laws of any state of the United States other than a crime classified as a
47 misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two
48 years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

49 (6) Has not been discharged under dishonorable conditions from the United States
50 Armed Forces;

51 (7) Has not engaged in a pattern of behavior, documented in public or closed records,
52 that causes the sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant presents a danger to
53 himself or others;

54 (8) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of application or for five years
55 prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental health facility, as defined in
56 section 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state following a hearing at which
57 the defendant was represented by counsel or a representative;

58 (9) Submits a completed application for a permit as described in subsection 3 of this
59 section;

60 (10) Submits an affidavit attesting that the applicant complies with the concealed
61 carry safety training requirement pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 of section 571.111;

62 (11) Is not the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

63 **and**

64 (12) Is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a firearm under section 571.070 or
65 18 U.S.C. Section 922(g).

66 3. The application for a concealed carry permit issued by the sheriff of the county of
67 the applicant's residence shall contain only the following information:

68 (1) The applicant's name, address, telephone number, gender, date and place of birth,
69 and, if the applicant is not a United States citizen, the applicant's country of citizenship and
70 any alien or admission number issued by the Federal Bureau of Customs and Immigration
71 Enforcement or any successor agency;

72 (2) An affirmation that the applicant has assumed residency in Missouri or is a
73 member of the Armed Forces stationed in Missouri or the spouse of such a member of the
74 Armed Forces and is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;

75 (3) An affirmation that the applicant is at least ~~nineteen~~ **twenty-one** years of age or
76 is eighteen years of age or older and a member of the United States Armed Forces or
77 honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces;

78 (4) An affirmation that the applicant has not pled guilty to or been convicted of a
79 crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state
80 or of the United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any
81 state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an
82 explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

83 (5) An affirmation that the applicant has not been convicted of, pled guilty to, or
84 entered a plea of nolo contendere to one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of
85 violence within a five-year period immediately preceding application for a permit or if the
86 applicant has not been convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses involving driving
87 while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse of a
88 controlled substance within a five-year period immediately preceding application for a
89 permit;

90 (6) An affirmation that the applicant is not a fugitive from justice or currently charged
91 in an information or indictment with the commission of a crime punishable by imprisonment
92 for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the United States other than a
93 crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of
94 imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm
95 silencer or gas gun;

96 (7) An affirmation that the applicant has not been discharged under dishonorable
97 conditions from the United States Armed Forces;

98 (8) An affirmation that the applicant is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time
99 of application or for five years prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental
100 health facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state,
101 except that a person whose release or discharge from a facility in this state pursuant to chapter
102 632, or a similar discharge from a facility in another state, occurred more than five years ago
103 without subsequent recommitment may apply;

104 (9) An affirmation that the applicant has received firearms safety training that meets
105 the standards of applicant firearms safety training defined in subsection 1 or 2 of section
106 571.111;

107 (10) An affirmation that the applicant, to the applicant's best knowledge and belief, is
108 not the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

109 (11) A conspicuous warning that false statements made by the applicant will result in
110 prosecution for perjury pursuant to the laws of the state of Missouri; and

111 (12) A government-issued photo identification. This photograph shall not be
112 included on the permit and shall only be used to verify the person's identity for permit
113 renewal, or for the issuance of a new permit due to change of address, or for a lost or
114 destroyed permit.

115 4. An application for a concealed carry permit shall be made to the sheriff of the
116 county or any city not within a county in which the applicant resides. An application shall be
117 filed in writing, signed under oath and under the penalties of perjury, and shall state whether
118 the applicant complies with each of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this section.

119 In addition to the completed application, the applicant for a concealed carry permit must also
120 submit the following:

121 (1) A photocopy of a firearms safety training certificate of completion or other
122 evidence of completion of a firearms safety training course that meets the standards
123 established in subsection 1 or 2 of section 571.111; and

124 (2) A nonrefundable permit fee as provided by subsection 11 or 12 of this section.

125 5. (1) Before an application for a concealed carry permit is approved, the sheriff shall
126 make only such inquiries as he or she deems necessary into the accuracy of the statements
127 made in the application. The sheriff may require that the applicant display a Missouri driver's
128 license or nondriver's license or military identification and orders showing the person being
129 stationed in Missouri. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a concealed carry
130 permit, the applicant shall be fingerprinted. No other biometric data shall be collected from
131 the applicant. The sheriff shall conduct an inquiry of the National Instant Criminal
132 Background Check System within three working days after submission of the properly
133 completed application for a concealed carry permit. If no disqualifying record is identified by
134 these checks at the state level, the fingerprints shall be forwarded to the Federal Bureau of
135 Investigation for a national criminal history record check. Upon receipt of the completed
136 report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System and the response from
137 the Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history record check, the sheriff shall
138 examine the results and, if no disqualifying information is identified, shall issue a concealed
139 carry permit within three working days.

140 (2) In the event the report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check
141 System and the response from the Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history
142 record check prescribed by subdivision (1) of this subsection are not completed within forty-
143 five calendar days and no disqualifying information concerning the applicant has otherwise
144 come to the sheriff's attention, the sheriff shall issue a provisional permit, clearly designated
145 on the certificate as such, which the applicant shall sign in the presence of the sheriff or the
146 sheriff's designee. This permit, when carried with a valid Missouri driver's or nondriver's
147 license or a valid military identification, shall permit the applicant to exercise the same rights
148 in accordance with the same conditions as pertain to a concealed carry permit issued under
149 this section, provided that it shall not serve as an alternative to an national instant criminal
150 background check required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922(t). The provisional permit shall remain
151 valid until such time as the sheriff either issues or denies the certificate of qualification under
152 subsection 6 or 7 of this section. The sheriff shall revoke a provisional permit issued under
153 this subsection within twenty-four hours of receipt of any report that identifies a disqualifying
154 record, and shall notify the concealed carry permit system established under subsection 5 of
155 section 650.350. The revocation of a provisional permit issued under this section shall be

156 proscribed in a manner consistent to the denial and review of an application under subsection
157 6 of this section.

158 6. The sheriff may refuse to approve an application for a concealed carry permit if he
159 or she determines that any of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this section have
160 not been met, or if he or she has a substantial and demonstrable reason to believe that the
161 applicant has rendered a false statement regarding any of the provisions of sections 571.101
162 to 571.121. If the applicant is found to be ineligible, the sheriff is required to deny the
163 application, and notify the applicant in writing, stating the grounds for denial and informing
164 the applicant of the right to submit, within thirty days, any additional documentation relating
165 to the grounds of the denial. Upon receiving any additional documentation, the sheriff shall
166 reconsider his or her decision and inform the applicant within thirty days of the result of the
167 reconsideration. The applicant shall further be informed in writing of the right to appeal the
168 denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114. After two additional reviews
169 and denials by the sheriff, the person submitting the application shall appeal the denial
170 pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.

171 7. If the application is approved, the sheriff shall issue a concealed carry permit to the
172 applicant within a period not to exceed three working days after his or her approval of the
173 application. The applicant shall sign the concealed carry permit in the presence of the sheriff
174 or his or her designee.

42 permit or is not a current resident of this state.
- 43 Defendant has pled guilty to or been convicted of a crime
44 punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding two years under
45 the laws of any state or of the United States other than a crime
46 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
47 punishable by a term of imprisonment of one year or less that does
48 not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas
49 gun.
- 50 Defendant has been convicted of, pled guilty to or entered a plea of
51 nolo contendere to one or more misdemeanor offenses involving
52 crimes of violence within a five-year period immediately
53 preceding application for a Missouri lifetime or extended
54 concealed carry permit issued pursuant to sections 571.205 to

55 571.230, RSMo, or the defendant has been convicted of two or
56 more misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the
57 influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse
58 of a controlled substance within a five-year period immediately
59 preceding application for a concealed carry permit issued pursuant
60 to sections 571.205 to 571.230, RSMo.

61 Defendant is a fugitive from justice or currently charged in an
62 information or indictment with the commission of a crime
63 punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under
64 the laws of any state of the United States other than a crime
65 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
66 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that
67 does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or
68 gas gun.

69 Defendant has been discharged under dishonorable conditions
70 from the United States Armed Forces.

71 Defendant is reasonably believed by the sheriff to be a danger to
72 self or others based on previous, documented pattern.

73 Defendant is adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of
74 application or for five years prior to application, or has been
75 committed to a mental health facility, as defined in section
76 632.005, RSMo, or a similar institution located in another state,
77 except that a person whose release or discharge from a facility in
78 this state pursuant to chapter 632, RSMo, or a similar discharge
79 from a facility in another state, occurred more than five years ago
80 without subsequent recommitment may apply.

81 Defendant failed to submit a completed application for a concealed
82 carry permit issued pursuant to sections 571.205 to 571.230,
83 RSMo.

84 Defendant failed to submit to or failed to clear the required
85 background check. (Note: This does not apply if the defendant has
86 submitted to a background check and been issued a provisional
87 permit pursuant to subdivision (2) of subsection 6 of section
88 571.205, RSMo, and the results of the background check are still
89 pending.)

- 90 Defendant failed to submit an affidavit attesting that the applicant
- 91 complies with the concealed carry safety training requirement
- 92 pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 of section 571.111, RSMo.
- 93 Defendant is otherwise disqualified from possessing a firearm
- 94 pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Section 922(g) or section 571.070, RSMo,

102 2. If at the hearing the plaintiff shows that the defendant was not eligible for the
 103 Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit issued under sections 571.205 to
 104 571.230 at the time of issuance or renewal or is no longer eligible for a Missouri lifetime or
 105 extended concealed carry permit the court shall issue an appropriate order to cause the
 106 revocation of the Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit. Costs shall not be
 107 assessed against the sheriff.

108 3. The finder of fact, in any action brought against a permit holder under subsection 1
 109 of this section, shall make findings of fact and the court shall make conclusions of law
 110 addressing the issues at dispute. If it is determined that the plaintiff in such an action acted
 111 without justification or with malice or primarily with an intent to harass the permit holder or
 112 that there was no reasonable basis to bring the action, the court shall order the plaintiff to pay
 113 the defendant/respondent all reasonable costs incurred in defending the action including, but
 114 not limited to, attorney's fees, deposition costs, and lost wages. Once the court determines
 115 that the plaintiff is liable to the defendant/respondent for costs and fees, the extent and type of
 116 fees and costs to be awarded should be liberally calculated in defendant/respondent's favor.
 117 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, reasonable attorney's fees shall be presumed to
 118 be at least one hundred fifty dollars per hour.

119 4. Any person aggrieved by any final judgment rendered by a small claims court in a
 120 petition for revocation of a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit may have a
 121 right to trial de novo as provided in sections 512.180 to 512.320.

122 5. The office of the county sheriff or any employee or agent of the county sheriff shall
 123 not be liable for damages in any civil action arising from alleged wrongful or improper
 124 granting, renewing, or failure to revoke a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
 125 permit issued under sections 571.205 to 571.230 so long as the sheriff acted in good faith.
