

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 348—ASSEMBLYMEN FRIERSON, SPIEGEL,
CARRILLO, DIAZ, DONDERO LOOP; COHEN AND FIORE

MARCH 18, 2013

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to foster care.
(BDR 38-457)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to foster care; establishing certain requirements for the operation of a foster care agency; requiring a foster care agency to create and maintain reports on its programs and services; allowing a foster care agency to encourage and assist a potential foster home to apply for a license; requiring a contract between a foster care agency and a provider of foster care with which the foster care agency places a child; requiring a foster care agency to provide certain services to each foster home in which the foster care agency places children; providing for the operation of independent living foster homes; allowing a licensing authority to suspend or revoke the license of a provider of foster care in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Under existing law, the Division of Child and Family Services of the
2 Department of Health and Human Services is required to adopt regulations relating
3 to the licensure and operation of foster homes and foster care agencies. (NRS
4 424.020, 424.093) **Sections 4-6** of this bill establish certain requirements for the
5 governance of a foster care agency. **Sections 8-14** of this bill establish certain
6 requirements for owners, members of the governing body, employees, paid
7 consultants, contractors, volunteers and vendors of a foster care agency. **Section 15**
8 of this bill requires a foster care agency to create and maintain an annual report on
9 each program or service the agency provides. **Section 16** of this bill allows a foster
10 care agency to identify potential foster homes and encourage a potential foster
11 home to apply for licensure. **Section 17** of this bill requires a foster care agency to



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12 coordinate the submission of applications for licensure as a foster home to the
13 licensing authority and to conduct a home study of each applicant. **Section 18** of
14 this bill requires a foster care agency to execute a contract containing certain
15 provisions with each provider of foster care with whom the foster care agency
16 places a child and to make each such contract available to the licensing authority
17 upon request. **Sections 19 and 20** of this bill require a foster care agency which
18 places children in a specialized foster home or an independent living foster home to
19 develop and implement certain provisions relating to the care the foster home
20 provides. **Section 21** of this bill requires a foster care agency to provide support to
21 and to review and evaluate its contracted foster homes. **Sections 22 and 23** of this
22 bill require a foster care agency to make crisis intervention available to its
23 contracted foster homes and to report certain potential violations to the licensing
24 authority. **Section 24** of this bill: (1) prohibits a foster care agency from accepting
25 certain children for placement in certain circumstances; and (2) requires a foster
26 care agency to give priority to assisting with the placement of children from an
27 agency which provides child welfare services or a juvenile court. **Section 25** of this
28 bill requires a foster care agency to monitor and evaluate its programs and services
29 and implement any necessary improvements to its programs and services revealed
30 by its evaluations. **Section 26** of this bill allows the licensing authority to charge
31 and collect certain fees from a foster care agency.

32 **Section 35** of this bill prohibits a foster home from accepting a child placed by
33 a juvenile court without the approval of the licensing authority. **Section 35** also
34 requires a specialized foster home or a group foster home to maintain a policy of
35 general liability insurance. **Section 36** of this bill revises the crimes that preclude a
36 person from being employed by or being a resident of a foster home. **Section 44** of
37 this bill allows a licensing authority to release certain information at the request of
38 a provider of foster care upon the payment of a fee to cover the costs of the
39 licensing authority in gathering that information. **Section 45** of this bill allows a
40 licensing authority to suspend or revoke the license of a provider of foster care in
41 certain circumstances.

42 **Sections 2, 34, 35, 38, 41, 42, 48, 50 and 54** of this bill provide for the
43 licensing and regulation of independent living foster homes.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 424 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 26, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *“Independent living foster home” means a foster*
5 *home which provides assistance with the transition to independent*
6 *living for children who have entered into an agreement to*
7 *transition to independent living and for children who:*

8 1. *Are at least 16 years of age but less than 18 years of age or*
9 *who remain under the jurisdiction of a court pursuant to*
10 *NRS 432B.594;*

11 2. *Are not related within the first degree of consanguinity or*
12 *affinity to any natural person maintaining or operating the home;*
13 *and*



1 3. *Are received, cared for and maintained for compensation*
2 *or otherwise, including the provision of free care.*

3 **Sec. 3.** *“Juvenile court” has the meaning ascribed to it in*
4 *NRS 62A.180.*

5 **Sec. 4. 1.** *A foster care agency must:*

6 (a) *Be organized as a business entity that is registered with the*
7 *Secretary of State and holds a valid state business license pursuant*
8 *to chapter 76 of NRS;*

9 (b) *Have a governing body, at least one member of which has*
10 *knowledge of and experience in the programs and services offered*
11 *by the foster care agency; and*

12 (c) *Operate under articles of incorporation.*

13 2. *The governing body of a foster care agency must have a*
14 *written constitution or bylaws which prescribe the responsibility*
15 *for the operation and maintenance of the foster care agency and*
16 *which must include, without limitation, provisions that:*

17 (a) *Define the qualifications for and types of membership on*
18 *the governing body;*

19 (b) *Specify the process for selecting members of the governing*
20 *body, the terms of office for the members and officers of the*
21 *governing body and orientation for new members of the governing*
22 *body;*

23 (c) *Specify how frequently the governing body must meet; and*

24 (d) *Specify prohibited conflicts of interest of members of the*
25 *governing body and employees, volunteers and independent*
26 *contractors of the foster care agency.*

27 3. *The governing body of a foster care agency shall appoint a*
28 *person to provide oversight of the foster care agency who meets*
29 *the qualifications described in section 8 of this act.*

30 4. *If the foster care agency is organized in another state, the*
31 *governing body must meet at least once each year within this State*
32 *or have a subcommittee whose members are residents of this State,*
33 *one of whom is a member of the governing body, which is*
34 *responsible to the governing body for ensuring that the foster care*
35 *agency complies with the provisions of this chapter and any*
36 *regulations adopted pursuant thereto.*

37 **Sec. 5.** *The governing body of a foster care agency must be*
38 *responsible for:*

39 1. *Ensuring that the foster care agency is and remains*
40 *fiscally sound;*

41 2. *Overseeing the management and operations of the*
42 *programs and services offered by the foster care agency;*

43 3. *Ensuring that the foster care agency remains in*
44 *compliance with the rules and policies of the governing body; and*



1 4. *Ensuring that the foster care agency complies with the*
2 *provisions of this chapter and any regulations adopted pursuant*
3 *thereto.*

4 **Sec. 6.** *The governing body shall submit annually to the*
5 *licensing authority or its designee:*

6 1. *The name, address, contact information, position held on*
7 *the governing body and any other information required by the*
8 *licensing authority of each member of the governing body;*

9 2. *A copy of the articles of incorporation, constitution and*
10 *bylaws of the foster care agency;*

11 3. *Evidence satisfactory to the licensing authority that the*
12 *foster care agency has the ability to financially support and*
13 *sustain its activities, which may include, without limitation,*
14 *financial statements and budgets;*

15 4. *A report from an independent auditor of the complete*
16 *financial information for the foster care agency for the*
17 *immediately preceding fiscal year;*

18 5. *A statement of purpose; and*

19 6. *An organizational chart or other chart that sets forth the*
20 *structure of the foster care agency which includes, without*
21 *limitation, a job description for each position listed in the chart.*

22 **Sec. 7.** *(Deleted by amendment.)*

23 **Sec. 8.** 1. *The person appointed to provide oversight of a*
24 *foster care agency by the governing body of the foster care agency*
25 *pursuant to section 4 of this act must have:*

26 (a) *A bachelor's degree or more advanced degree from an*
27 *accredited college or university; and*

28 (b) *At least 7 years of experience in an agency or program*
29 *which provides social services, including at least 3 years of*
30 *experience as an administrator, supervisor or consultant.*

31 2. *The person appointed to provide oversight of a foster care*
32 *agency is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the foster*
33 *care agency, including, without limitation, employing such staff as*
34 *he or she deems necessary to provide administrative services and*
35 *services to families and children. The staff may include, without*
36 *limitation:*

37 (a) *Program supervisors who are responsible for the*
38 *supervision of members of the staff and activities relating to foster*
39 *care and for assisting in formulating and carrying out the policies*
40 *and programs of the foster care agency. Each program supervisor*
41 *must have a bachelor's degree or more advanced degree from an*
42 *accredited college or university and at least 3 years of experience*
43 *in providing services to children and their families, including at*
44 *least 1 year of experience as an administrator or supervisor.*



1 (b) *Caseworkers who support the operations of the foster care*
2 *agency, including, without limitation, to work with children and*
3 *families, perform home studies, support service plans for*
4 *individualized cases and treatments, prepare and maintain records*
5 *and coordinate services for children and families. Each*
6 *caseworker must have:*

7 (1) *A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or*
8 *university in the field of social work or a field related to social*
9 *work, which may include, without limitation, psychology,*
10 *sociology, education or counseling; or*

11 (2) *A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or*
12 *university in any field and at least 2 years of experience in*
13 *providing services to children and their families.*

14 **Sec. 9.** 1. *The foster care agency may accept volunteers to*
15 *provide certain specified services for the foster care agency. The*
16 *foster care agency shall not rely solely upon volunteers to provide*
17 *any service.*

18 2. *If the foster care agency accepts volunteers pursuant to*
19 *subsection 1, the foster care agency must have a written plan for*
20 *the selection, training, supervision and assignment of volunteers,*
21 *and each volunteer who performs an activity that would otherwise*
22 *be performed by a member of the staff must meet the same*
23 *qualifications that would be required for the member of the staff.*

24 **Sec. 10.** 1. *The foster care agency shall develop and carry*
25 *out a written plan for the orientation, training, supervision and*
26 *evaluation of members of the staff.*

27 2. *The orientation must include, without limitation,*
28 *information on the policies and procedures of the foster care*
29 *agency, goals for the programs and services of the foster care*
30 *agency, the responsibilities of members of the staff and the*
31 *provisions of this chapter and the regulations adopted pursuant to*
32 *thereto that relate to licensing. The training must include, without*
33 *limitation, any training required by the licensing authority. Each*
34 *member of the staff must be evaluated at least once each year.*

35 3. *The foster care agency shall maintain comprehensive*
36 *written policies and procedures for the personnel, services and*
37 *programs of the foster care agency and make the policies and*
38 *procedures readily available to the members of the staff and to the*
39 *licensing authority.*

40 4. *The foster care agency shall maintain comprehensive*
41 *records for personnel that, upon request, must be made available*
42 *to the licensing authority.*

43 **Sec. 11.** 1. *The licensing authority or a person designated*
44 *by the licensing authority shall obtain from appropriate law*
45 *enforcement agencies information on the background and*



1 *personal history of each applicant for or holder of a license to*
2 *conduct a foster care agency and each owner, member of the*
3 *governing body, employee, paid consultant, contractor, volunteer*
4 *or vendor of that applicant or licensee who may come into direct*
5 *contact with a child placed by the foster care agency, to determine*
6 *whether the person investigated has been arrested for, has charges*
7 *pending for or has been convicted of:*

8 *(a) Murder, voluntary manslaughter or mayhem;*

9 *(b) Any other felony involving the use or threatened use of*
10 *force or violence against the victim or the use of a firearm or other*
11 *deadly weapon;*

12 *(c) Assault with intent to kill or to commit sexual assault or*
13 *mayhem;*

14 *(d) Sexual assault, statutory sexual seduction, incest, lewdness,*
15 *indecent exposure or any other sexually related crime or a felony*
16 *relating to prostitution;*

17 *(e) Abuse or neglect of a child or contributory delinquency;*

18 *(f) A violation of any federal or state law regulating the*
19 *possession, distribution or use of any controlled substance or any*
20 *dangerous drug as defined in chapter 454 of NRS;*

21 *(g) Abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of older persons or*
22 *vulnerable persons, including, without limitation, a violation of*
23 *any provision of NRS 200.5091 to 200.50995, inclusive, or a law of*
24 *any other jurisdiction that prohibits the same or similar conduct;*

25 *(h) Any offense involving fraud, theft, embezzlement, burglary,*
26 *robbery, fraudulent conversion or misappropriation of property*
27 *within the immediately preceding 7 years;*

28 *(i) Any offense relating to pornography involving minors,*
29 *including, without limitation, a violation of any provision of NRS*
30 *200.700 to 200.760, inclusive, or a law of any other jurisdiction*
31 *that prohibits the same or similar conduct;*

32 *(j) Prostitution, solicitation, lewdness or indecent exposure, or*
33 *any other sexually related crime that is punishable as a*
34 *misdemeanor, within the immediately preceding 7 years;*

35 *(k) A crime involving domestic violence that is punishable as a*
36 *felony;*

37 *(l) A crime involving domestic violence that is punishable as a*
38 *misdemeanor, within the immediately preceding 7 years;*

39 *(m) A criminal offense under the laws governing Medicaid or*
40 *Medicare, within the immediately preceding 7 years;*

41 *(n) Any offense involving the sale, furnishing, purchase,*
42 *consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages by a minor,*
43 *including, without limitation, a violation of any provision of NRS*
44 *202.015 to 202.067, inclusive, or driving a vehicle under the*
45 *influence of alcohol or a controlled substance in violation of*



1 *chapter 484C of NRS or a law of any other jurisdiction that*
2 *prohibits the same or similar conduct, within the immediately*
3 *preceding 7 years; or*

4 *(o) An attempt or conspiracy to commit any of the offenses*
5 *listed in this subsection within the immediately preceding 7 years.*

6 *2. The licensing authority or its approved designee may*
7 *charge each person investigated pursuant to this section for the*
8 *reasonable cost of that investigation.*

9 *3. Unless a preliminary Federal Bureau of Investigation*
10 *Interstate Identification Index name-based check of the records of*
11 *criminal history has been conducted pursuant to NRS 424.039, a*
12 *person who is required to submit to an investigation pursuant to*
13 *this section shall not have contact with a child in a foster home*
14 *without supervision before the investigation of the background*
15 *and personal history of the person is completed.*

16 *4. The licensing authority or its designee shall conduct an*
17 *investigation of each holder of a license to conduct a foster care*
18 *agency and each owner, member of a governing body, employee,*
19 *paid consultant, contractor, volunteer or vendor who may come*
20 *into direct contact with a child placed by the foster care agency*
21 *pursuant to this section at least once every 5 years after the initial*
22 *investigation.*

23 **Sec. 12.** *1. Each applicant for or holder of a license to*
24 *conduct a foster care agency, and each owner, member of the*
25 *governing body, employee, paid consultant, contractor, volunteer*
26 *or vendor of that applicant or licensee who may come into direct*
27 *contact with a child placed by the foster care agency, must submit*
28 *to the licensing authority or its approved designee:*

29 *(a) A complete set of fingerprints and written permission*
30 *authorizing the licensing authority or its approved designee to*
31 *forward those fingerprints to the Central Repository for Nevada*
32 *Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau*
33 *of Investigation for its report to enable the licensing authority or*
34 *its approved designee to conduct an investigation pursuant to*
35 *section 11 of this act; and*

36 *(b) Written permission to conduct a child abuse and neglect*
37 *screening.*

38 *2. For each person who submits the documentation required*
39 *pursuant to subsection 1, the licensing authority or its approved*
40 *designee shall conduct a child abuse and neglect screening of the*
41 *person in every state in which the person has resided during the*
42 *immediately preceding 5 years.*

43 *3. The licensing authority or its approved designee may*
44 *exchange with the Central Repository or the Federal Bureau of*



1 *Investigation any information respecting the fingerprints*
2 *submitted.*

3 *4. When a report from the Federal Bureau of Investigation is*
4 *received by the Central Repository, it shall immediately forward a*
5 *copy of the report to the licensing authority or its approved*
6 *designee.*

7 *5. Upon receiving a report pursuant to this section, the*
8 *licensing authority or its approved designee shall determine*
9 *whether the person has been arrested for, has charges pending for*
10 *or has been convicted of a crime listed in section 11 of this act.*

11 *6. The licensing authority shall immediately inform the foster*
12 *care agency whether an owner, member of the governing body,*
13 *employee, paid consultant, contractor, volunteer or vendor of the*
14 *foster care agency who may come into direct contact with a child*
15 *placed by the foster care agency has been arrested for, has charges*
16 *pending for or has been convicted of a crime listed in section 11 of*
17 *this act.*

18 **Sec. 13.** *1. Upon receiving information from the licensing*
19 *authority or its approved designee pursuant to section 12 of this*
20 *act or evidence from any other source that an owner, member of*
21 *the governing body, employee, consultant, contractor, volunteer or*
22 *vendor of a foster care agency who may come into direct contact*
23 *with a child placed by the foster care agency has been arrested for,*
24 *has charges pending for or has been convicted of a crime listed in*
25 *section 11 of this act, the foster care agency shall terminate the*
26 *employment, contract or volunteer activities of the person after*
27 *allowing the person time to correct the information as required*
28 *pursuant to subsection 2.*

29 *2. If a person believes that the information provided about*
30 *him or her pursuant to subsection 1 is incorrect, the person must*
31 *inform the foster care agency immediately. A foster care agency*
32 *that is so informed shall give the person 30 days to correct the*
33 *information.*

34 *3. During the period in which a person seeks to correct*
35 *information pursuant to subsection 2, it is within the discretion of*
36 *the foster care agency whether to allow the person to continue to*
37 *be associated with the foster care agency, except that the person*
38 *must not have contact with a child in any foster home without*
39 *supervision during any such period.*

40 **Sec. 14.** *A member of the governing body, employee,*
41 *consultant, contractor, volunteer or vendor of a foster care agency*
42 *may not:*

43 *1. Be a provider of foster care who has a contract with the*
44 *foster care agency for the placement of children unless approved*
45 *by the licensing authority; or*



1 2. *Be a biological parent of a child in the custody of an*
2 *agency which provides child welfare services or of a child placed*
3 *by a juvenile court in a foster home operated by the foster care*
4 *agency.*

5 **Sec. 15.** 1. *A foster care agency shall create and maintain*
6 *an annual report concerning each program or service provided by*
7 *the foster care agency.*

8 2. *The report must include, without limitation, a description*
9 *of each program or service provided by the foster care agency, the*
10 *goals for the program or service relating to family foster homes,*
11 *specialized foster homes, independent living foster homes and*
12 *group foster homes and information relating to any special*
13 *populations of children served, including, without limitation,*
14 *children who require special care for physical, mental or*
15 *emotional issues or who were placed in a foster home by a juvenile*
16 *court.*

17 **Sec. 16.** 1. *A foster care agency may identify potential*
18 *foster homes and encourage a potential foster home to apply to the*
19 *licensing authority for a license to conduct a foster home.*

20 2. *A foster care agency shall ensure that each person with*
21 *whom it contracts as a provider of foster care receives any training*
22 *required by the provisions of this chapter or by the licensing*
23 *authority, including, without limitation, specific training to meet*
24 *the needs of a population that requires specific services.*

25 **Sec. 17.** 1. *A foster care agency shall coordinate the*
26 *submission of applications for the licensing of prospective foster*
27 *homes with the licensing authority.*

28 2. *A foster care agency shall conduct a fair and impartial*
29 *investigation of the home and standards of care for each*
30 *prospective foster home.*

31 3. *Upon receiving a completed application for a prospective*
32 *foster home from a foster care agency, the licensing authority*
33 *must review the qualifications of the prospective foster home to be*
34 *licensed pursuant to NRS 424.030.*

35 4. *The licensing authority may provide any training it*
36 *determines to be necessary to a foster care agency for the foster*
37 *care agency to fulfill the provisions of this section.*

38 **Sec. 18.** 1. *A foster care agency may not assist an agency*
39 *which provides child welfare services or a juvenile court in the*
40 *placement of a child in foster care unless a contract exists between*
41 *the foster care agency and the provider of foster care for the*
42 *placement of children. Such a contract must include, without*
43 *limitation, provisions that:*

44 (a) *Allow the provider of foster care to change its affiliation*
45 *with the foster care agency or to terminate its affiliation with the*



1 *foster care agency and become affiliated with a different foster*
2 *care agency.*

3 *(b) Specify the type of foster home and related services that the*
4 *provider of foster care will provide on behalf of the foster care*
5 *agency, including, without limitation, the services that each party*
6 *agrees to provide for foster children, biological families and foster*
7 *families.*

8 *(c) Specify the financial responsibilities of each party,*
9 *including, without limitation, payment for both foster care and for*
10 *any other expenses or services rendered, including, without*
11 *limitation, providing clothing for children in its care.*

12 *(d) Waive the right of the provider of foster care to*
13 *confidentiality relating to any investigations for licensing or child*
14 *protective services and allow the agency which provides child*
15 *welfare services and the licensing authority to share any related*
16 *information about an investigation with the foster care agency*
17 *after the investigation is completed.*

18 *(e) State how emergencies which occur during and outside*
19 *regular business hours will be handled.*

20 *(f) Require arrangements to be made for foster children to*
21 *have visitation with their biological families.*

22 *(g) Describe expectations which ensure that children will*
23 *receive appropriate medical, dental, mental health, psychological*
24 *and psychiatric treatment, including, without limitation, how*
25 *transportation will be provided.*

26 *(h) Require the provider of foster care to adhere to the*
27 *provisions of this chapter and the regulations adopted pursuant*
28 *thereto relating to licensing.*

29 *(i) State that the parties agree that the licensing authority*
30 *maintains the responsibility to protect the best interests of each*
31 *child, which may include removing a child from the placement*
32 *with the provider of foster care if the licensing authority*
33 *determines that removal is in the best interests of the child.*

34 *(j) Include the acknowledgment by the parties of any*
35 *provisions determined to be appropriate by the licensing authority.*

36 *2. The foster care agency, upon request, shall make each*
37 *such contract available to the licensing authority within a*
38 *reasonable period after receiving its request.*

39 **Sec. 19. 1. A foster care agency which places children in a**
40 **specialized foster home shall develop and carry out written policies**
41 **and procedures relating to children placed in specialized foster**
42 **homes which must include, without limitation:**

43 *(a) The service and treatment philosophy of the foster care*
44 *agency for children with physical, mental or emotional issues and*



1 *children who are placed in a specialized foster home by a juvenile*
2 *court;*

3 *(b) Specific treatment techniques that the foster care agency*
4 *plans to approve for use with children described in paragraph (a)*
5 *and their families;*

6 *(c) Specific strategies for behavior management that the foster*
7 *care agency will allow providers of foster care to use with children*
8 *described in paragraph (a); and*

9 *(d) Adequate staffing to provide the intensity of services*
10 *required when caring for children described in paragraph (a).*

11 *2. A foster care agency shall require a provider of foster care*
12 *to serve as an active participant in the treatment or care plan of a*
13 *child who is placed in a specialized foster home. The foster care*
14 *agency shall:*

15 *(a) Provide services to support the provider of foster care in*
16 *reducing barriers in caring for and supporting any children*
17 *placed in a specialized foster home;*

18 *(b) Arrange or provide support for the provider of foster care*
19 *to arrange for the child to receive appropriate clinical services,*
20 *including, without limitation, psychiatric, psychological and*
21 *medication management services; and*

22 *(c) Ensure cooperation between the employees of the foster*
23 *care agency, the provider of foster care, the child and the*
24 *biological family of the child in meeting the goals of the child's*
25 *treatment plan.*

26 *3. A foster care agency which places children in a specialized*
27 *foster home shall have a written plan for alternative care in the*
28 *event of an emergency if the placement of the child into a*
29 *specialized foster home disrupts that specialized foster home.*

30 **Sec. 20. 1. A foster care agency which places children in**
31 **an independent living foster home shall develop and implement**
32 **written policies and procedures relating to children placed in**
33 **independent living foster homes which must include, without**
34 **limitation:**

35 *(a) A process for ensuring that a potential location for an*
36 *independent living arrangement meets any standards required by*
37 *the licensing authority and is evaluated on a regular basis to*
38 *ensure that it continues to meet such standards;*

39 *(b) A procedure for approving a location for an independent*
40 *living arrangement;*

41 *(c) Criteria and procedures for intake and admission into the*
42 *independent living foster home and discharge from the*

42 (b) Environmental crimes;

43 (c) Explosives and pyrotechnics;

44 (d) Drugs or other controlled substances; or

45 (e) Any similar activity specified by the State Fire Marshal.



1 12. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, any
2 regulations of the State Fire Marshal concerning matters relating to
3 building codes, including, without limitation, matters relating to the
4 construction, maintenance or safety of buildings, structures and
5 property in this State:

6 (a) Do not apply in a county whose population is 700,000 or
7 more which has adopted a code at least as stringent as the
8 International Fire Code and the International Building Code,
9 published by the International Code Council. To maintain the
10 exemption from the applicability of the regulations of the State Fire
11 Marshal pursuant to this subsection, the code of the county must be
12 at least as stringent as the most recently published edition of the
13 International Fire Code and the International Building Code within 1
14 year after publication of such an edition.

15 (b) Apply in a county described in paragraph (a) with respect to
16 state-owned or state-occupied buildings or public schools in the
17 county and in those local jurisdictions in the county in which the
18 State Fire Marshal is requested to exercise that authority by the chief
19 executive officer of that jurisdiction. As used in this paragraph,
20 "public school" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 385.007.
