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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to firearms; disallowing regulation
8 for certain firearm suppressor; providing for
9 qualifications; requiring certain descriptor;
10 prohibiting enforcement by certain entities and
11 employees; restricting state grant funds; providing
12 definitions; providing for codification; and
13 providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1289.31 of Title 21, unless
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. A firearm suppressor that is manufactured in this state and
19 remains in this state shall not be subject to federal law or federal
20 regulation including registration, under the authority of the United
21 States Congress to regulate interstate commerce.

22 1. A basic material from which a firearm suppressor is
23 manufactured in this state including unmachined steel, is not a
24 firearm suppressor and is not subject to federal regulation under

1 the authority of the United States Congress to regulate interstate
2 commerce as if it were a firearm suppressor.

3 2. A firearm suppressor manufactured and sold in this state
4 must have the words "Made in Oklahoma" clearly stamped on it.

5 B. For purposes of this section, a firearm suppressor is
6 manufactured in this state if the item is manufactured:

7 1. In this state from basic materials; and

8 2. Without the inclusion of any part imported from another
9 state other than a generic and insignificant part.

10 C. For purposes of this section, a firearm suppressor is
11 manufactured in this state if it is manufactured without regard to
12 whether a firearm imported into this state from another state is
13 attached to or used in conjunction with the suppressor.

14 D. No municipality or other political subdivision shall adopt a
15 rule, order, ordinance, or policy under which the entity enforces,
16 or by consistent action allows the enforcement of a federal statute,
17 order, rule, or regulation that purports to regulate a firearm
18 suppressor if the statute, order, rule, or regulation imposes a
19 prohibition, restriction, or other regulation that does not exist
20 under the laws of this state.

21 E. No person employed by or otherwise under the direction or
22 control of a municipality or other political subdivision shall
23 enforce or attempt to enforce any federal statute, ordinance, rule,
24 or regulation described by subsection B of this section.

1 F. No municipality or political subdivision shall receive state
2 grant funds if the entity adopts a rule, order, ordinance, or policy
3 under which the entity enforces a federal law described by
4 subsection A of this section.

5 G. As used in this section:

6 1. "Firearm" shall have the same definition as provided in
7 Section 1289.3 of this title;

8 2. "Firearm suppressor" means any device designed, made, or
9 adapted to muffle the report of a firearm;

10 3. "Generic and insignificant part" means an item that has
11 manufacturing or consumer product applications other than inclusion
12 in a firearm suppressor. The term includes a spring, screw, nut,
13 and pin; and

14 4. "Manufacture" includes forging, castling, machining, or
15 another process for working a material.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
