A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the week of January 22 through 26, 2025, as "Gun Violence Survivors Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Gun violence, whether intentional or unintentional,
- 4 involves the use of a firearm to commit violent acts, such as
- 5 armed robbery, aggravated assault, suicide, homicide, domestic
- 6 violence and mass shootings; and
- 7 WHEREAS, A gun violence survivor is anyone who has personally
- 8 experienced gun violence, whether having been threatened or
- 9 wounded with a gun or having witnessed an act of gun violence,
- 10 or a family member or friend of someone who was wounded or
- 11 killed as a result of gun violence; and
- 12 WHEREAS, For every person who dies from gun violence, more
- 13 than two survive; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Nine out of ten gun violence survivors report
- 15 experiencing trauma from the incident; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Among those persons who experienced gun violence
- 17 within the last 12 months, more than half indicated the

- 1 resulting trauma affected their well-being and ability to
- 2 function; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Half of survivors reported that they experienced gun
- 4 violence in a home, whether their own or that of a neighbor,
- 5 friend or family member; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Nurses, doctors and medical or hospital staff were
- 7 the most likely to say they experienced the impact of gun
- 8 violence through their work, followed by school employees, such
- 9 as teachers and staff; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Two-thirds of survivors are in need of mental health
- 11 services, therapy and support; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Nearly half of survivors require crime victim legal
- 13 assistance; and
- 14 WHEREAS, For 40% of survivors, financial assistance is
- 15 necessary to deal with medical expenses, such as physical
- 16 therapy, rehabilitation services and surgical equipment; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Home health care is needed for one in four
- 18 survivors; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Seven percent of survivors need assistance to cover
- 20 funeral-related expenses; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Fifty-nine percent of American adults have been
- 22 impacted by gun violence in their lifetime; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Three million children are affected by gun violence
- 24 every year; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Currently, more than 1 million women living in the
- 26 United States have been shot or shot at by their significant
- 27 other; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Nearly 3.7 million women in the United States have
- 29 been threatened with a gun by their significant other; and
- 30 WHEREAS, In an average year, 1,574 families and communities

- 1 are affected by gun violence and the pain, fear and trauma
- 2 associated with it; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Gun violence rose more than 20% in Pennsylvania in
- 4 the last 10 years; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In addition to the devastating human cost, every
- 6 year gun violence costs the Pennsylvania economy \$567 million;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Every Murder Is Real (EMIR) Healing Center in
- 9 Philadelphia provides a holistic and trauma-informed approach to
- 10 healing for those left in the wake of gun violence; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The EMIR Healing Center provides many services to
- 12 support and assist families and communities, including
- 13 individual and group grief support, assistance with victim
- 14 compensation and education and navigation through the criminal
- 15 justice system; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Mothers In Charge is a group of impassioned mothers,
- 17 grandmothers, aunts, sisters and others who are committed to
- 18 working toward saving lives through providing counseling and
- 19 grief support services for families who have been impacted by
- 20 gun violence; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Moms Demand Action is a national network of parents,
- 22 families, students and concerned citizens dedicated to keeping
- 23 families safe, encouraging responsible gun ownership and
- 24 advocating for common-sense gun safety legislation; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Moms Demand Action, along with Mayors Against
- 26 Illegal Guns, Students Demand Action and the Everytown Survivor
- 27 Network, is part of Everytown for Gun Safety, the largest gun
- 28 violence prevention organization in the country, with nearly 10
- 29 million supporters and more than 350,000 donors; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Everytown for Gun Safety is joined by several other

- 1 national nonprofit organizations, including the Brady Campaign
- 2 and Giffords Law Center, in the pursuit to end gun violence in
- 3 America; and
- 4 WHEREAS, A gun violence survivor described the personal
- 5 trauma as follows: "Dealing with the inconsistencies of healing,
- 6 both physically and emotionally. The existence of being this
- 7 gray person in a world where everyone else sees everything as
- 8 black and white. I'm either completely fine and it's over and
- 9 done, or I'm this wounded person who can never be functional -
- 10 the lack of understanding that I am not really either, but some
- 11 days may be one or the other"; and
- 12 WHEREAS, "Gun Violence Survivors Week" is an acknowledgment
- 13 of the pain and suffering felt by survivors of gun violence who
- 14 continue to live with that trauma; and
- 15 WHEREAS, By recognizing "Gun Violence Survivors Week," the
- 16 Commonwealth joins communities across America to raise awareness
- 17 of its broad impact on society and express empathy to those who
- 18 have endured pain as a result of a firearm; therefore be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the week of January 22
- 20 through 26, 2025, as "Gun Violence Survivors Week" in
- 21 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the Every Murder Is Real
- 23 Healing Center, Mothers In Charge, Moms Demand Action and other
- 24 gun violence prevention organizations for their efforts in
- 25 addressing gun violence and in the pursuit of building safer
- 26 communities for the residents of this Commonwealth and citizens
- 27 of this country.
