1	Relating to: proclaiming June 6, 2025, as Gun Violence Awareness Day in
2	Wisconsin.
3	Whereas, the U.S. Supreme Court has recognized that the right to bear arms
4	under the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution is not unlimited and allows
5	for reasonable restrictions on firearms, including who can have firearms and under
6	what conditions, where firearms can be carried, and what types of firearms are
7	permissible; and
8	Whereas, firearms have become the number one cause of death for children in
9	the United States and Wisconsin; and
10	Whereas, on average, every day in the United States, approximately 327
11	people are injured or killed with guns in murders, assaults, suicides, and accidents;
12	and
13	Whereas, in Wisconsin, approximately 741 men, women, and children are

1	killed with guns each year, 64 percent of whom die as a result of suicide by firearm;
2	and
3	Whereas, in Wisconsin, over 1,500 people are wounded each year by guns; and
4	Whereas, gun deaths devastate families in urban, rural, and suburban areas;
5	and
6	Whereas, while Wisconsin's urban areas are disproportionately affected by
7	gun homicide, the state's less populated areas experience greater rates of gun
8	suicide; and
9	Whereas, gun violence costs our country \$557.2 billion in combined direct and
10	indirect expenses annually; and
11	Whereas, studies show that gun safety laws save lives and are associated with
12	lower firearm death rates; and
13	Whereas, Wisconsin has a long tradition of responsible gun ownership, safe
14	gun usage, and training to hunt with firearms; now, therefore, be it
15	Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the legislature
16	hereby proclaims June 6, 2025, as Gun Violence Awareness Day in Wisconsin.
